The council was presented with a signed complaint. Motion by Winquist seconded by Kastner to take complaint to Magistrate Court. Ayes all.

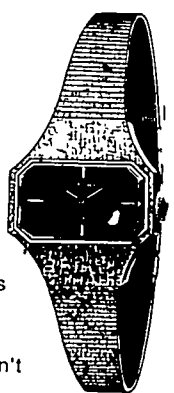
Motion by Kastner seconded by Lindstrom to approve Julie Blunk building permit. Ayes all.

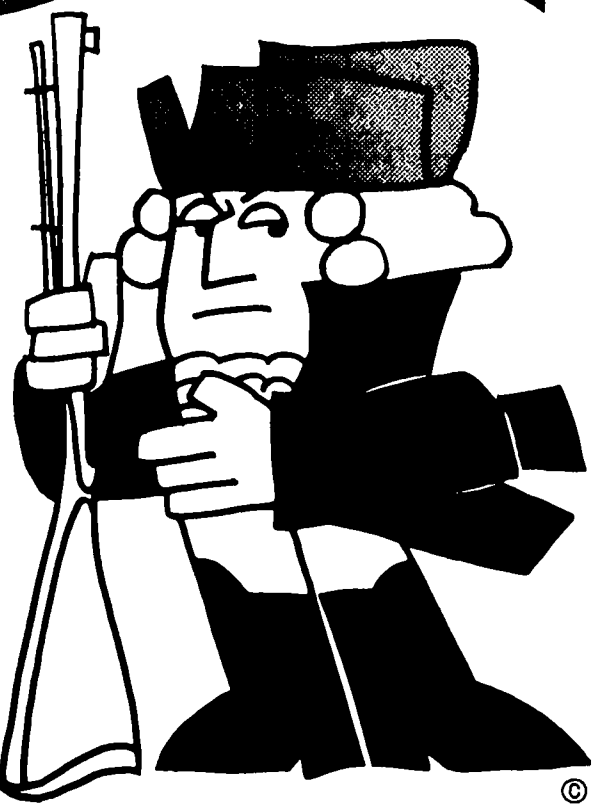
